- **Bridging Non-Formal & Formal Education:** Moving away from rigid textbook learning toward interactive engagement.





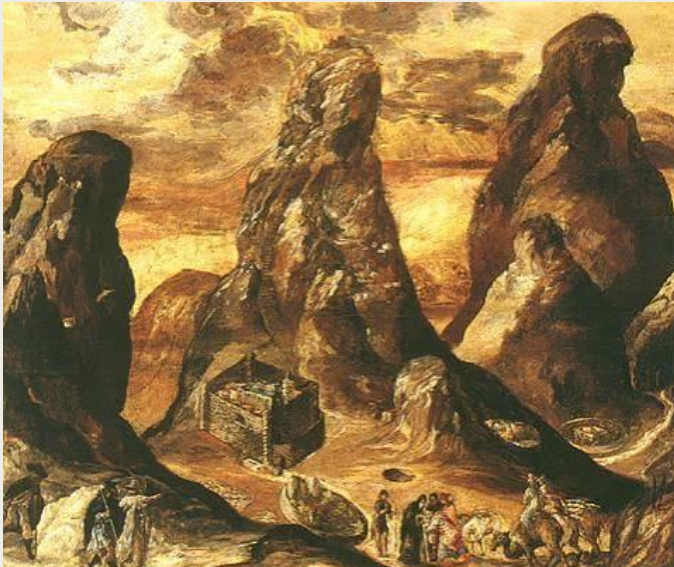
Fostering Critical Thinking & Media Literacy

 - *Ottoman Era: Everyday cultural coexistence, architecture, music, and urban transformation.*
- **Embracing Diversity & Multiculturalism:**
 - *Recognizing that modern local identity is a living tapestry woven from diverse cultures.*
 - *Fostering openness, challenging prejudice, and promoting inclusion in contemporary society.*
- **Engaging Older Students on Global Values:**
 - *Critical dialogue on expansionist practices, foreign rule, and occupation.*

Expanding Audiences & Inclusive Lifelong Learning

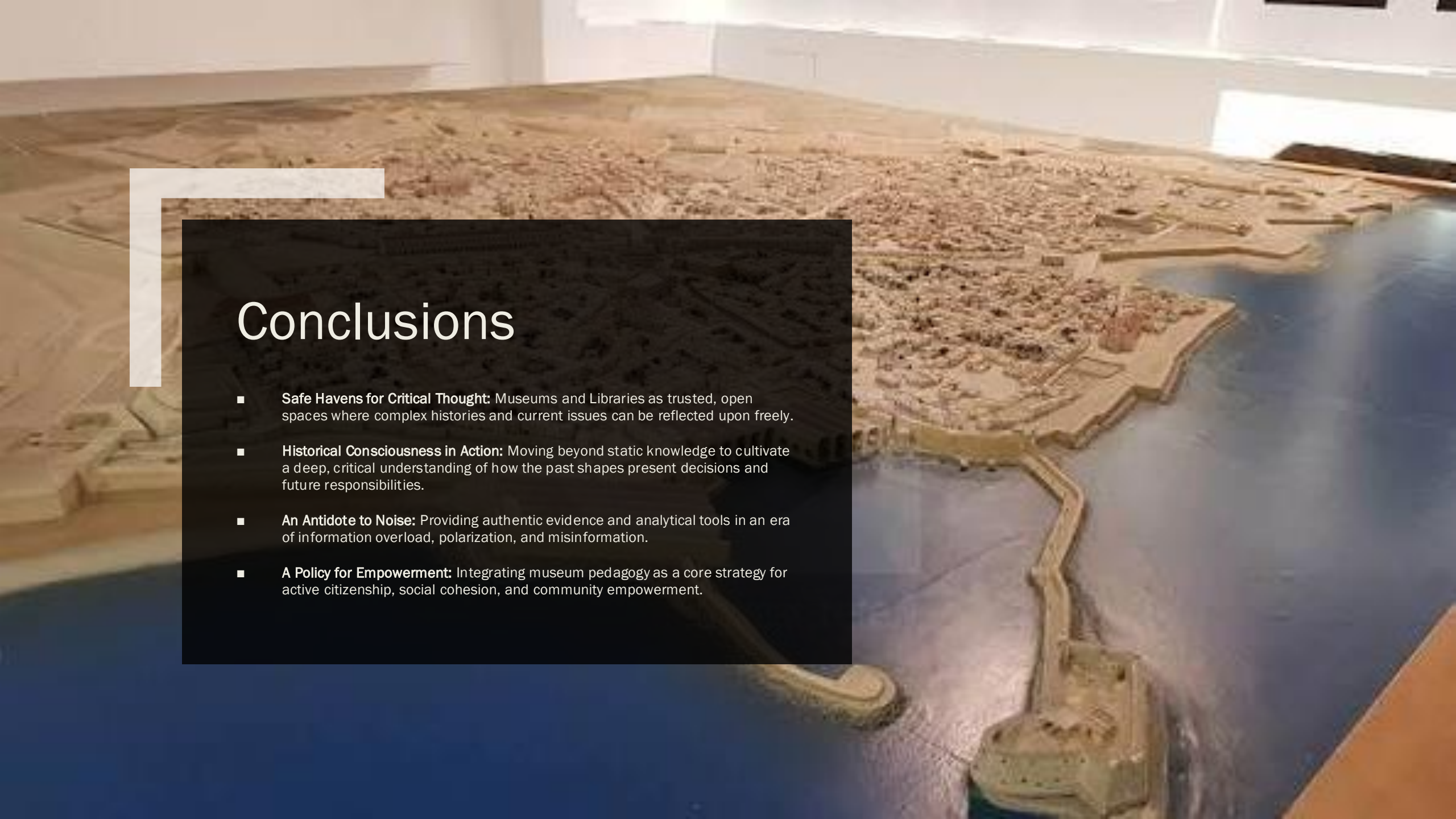
- **Beyond School Groups:** Designing tailored educational initiatives for adult learners, intergenerational groups, and senior citizens.
